6. DELEGATIONS AND PRESENTATIONS

Bruce Hayter, Trustee, District School Board Ontario North East Re: annual communication to local councils

Mr. Hayter thanks members of Council for allowing him to make this presentation. He notes he is new as trustee for the CDSBONE Board; he first off wishes to explain how he became trustee.

He came to Hearst 14 years ago when his wife got a job at the hospital. The first four years, he worked for College Boréal in Constance Lake and then at Clayton Brown Public School. He took over the trustee seat when Wayne Major retired.

Mr. Hayter explains his presence tonight is as messenger for the school board. He notes all school boards are now required by the Province to meet annually with each municipality and industry of the school district. Mr. Hayter proceeds by reading the appended report.

In response to questions from members of Council, Mr. Hayter replies:

- Hearst and Kapuskasing need to recognize that Passeport Jeunesse is the fastest growing school and that enrolment of all other schools is declining;
- Passeport Jeunesse needs space;
- A budget of \$18 million was approved for renovations of all schools in the district;
- He would like to talk with others to see what can be done, together;
- Smooth Rock Falls Grade 7 and 8 students now attend school in Kapuskasing, which boosted enrolments in that community;
- They wish to get input from all Councils of the district;
- The school boards need to prepare now in light of the probable upcoming mining operations in the area, which would bring more students:
- All high schools will get smudging rooms with special ventilation systems.

The Mayor thanks Mr. Hayter for his presentation.

Luc Lanoix, René Fontaine Municipal Airport Manager Re : Need for infrastruction evaluation of the municipal airport

Mr. Lanoix thanks members of Council for allowing him to make this presentation. He explains the reason of his presentation is to convey the need for the Town to perform a thorough evaluation of the aging airport infrastructure. A documentation package of the presentation is appended herewith.

In response to questions from members of Council, Mr. Lanoix replies:

- We need to invest in the airport if we want to be competitive with other communities in the area;
- An evaluation done by consultants would cost approximately \$35,000;
- The Municipality actually invests \$5,000 per year in the upkeep of the landing strip;
- The fuel system has never been upgraded and the lighting system was last upgraded in 1994;
- A consultant would speak with stakeholders, Council and clients and would evaluate revenues and other possibilities;
- The Notre-Dame Hospital CT scan could create opportunities.
