2020 Annual Accessibility Status Report

The Accessibility Status Report is an annual update on the progress of the measures taken to improve accessibility and implement the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005, (AODA) and the Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation (O. Reg. 191/11).

This Status Report includes the accessibility initiatives and improvements that were completed in 2019 to implement the strategies outlined in the Town of Hearst Multi-Year Accessibility Plan. The purpose of this Status Report is to make the public aware of the Town of Hearst's progress with regards to the 2019-2023 Multi-Year Accessibility Plan.

Our Commitment to Accessibility

The Town of Hearst is committed to eliminating barriers and improving access to persons with disabilities by providing citizens with an inclusive accessible community through policies that promote dignity, independence, integration and equal opportunity for all citizens.

The Town of Hearst commits to work under the legislative frameworks of the OADA, the Ontario Human Rights Code, 1990 and other legislation to ensure compliance with accessibility standards is achieved.

Through the development of the Town of Hearst 2019-2023 Multi-Year Accessibility Plan, the Accessibility Advisory Committee identified key priorities which align with the Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulations as found in O. Reg. 191/11:

The year 2020 having been an exceptional one considering the Covid-19 pandemic, municipal services were dramatically affected. The following tasks and projects were carried on:

- Despite the unusual circumstances, the Town of Hearst maintained its standards and continued to accommodate those clients with special needs.
- Accessibility training for new staff and the reduced number of summer employees was undertaken.
- Meetings of the Accessibility Committee were held via teleconference.
- Development and installation of the new multi-generational accessible play structure at Al Kinsey Park.

- Installation of handicap accessible doors at René Fontaine Municipal Airport.
- Addition of designated handicapped parking spaces at the Double Rink Tournament Hall at the Claude Larose Recreation Centre and at the Heritage Sawmill Marketplace.
