



SUMMARY OF MUNICIPAL COUNCIL MEETING OF JUNE 2, 2026



POLICY

- Establishment of the 2026 Joint Election Compliance Audit Committee, representing the municipalities of Hearst to Cochrane.
- Support of Mayor Sigouin's candidacy to sit on the Board of Directors of the Association of Municipalities of Ontario, as representative of the Northern caucus, Northeast region, for the 2026-2028 term.
- Delegation of authority to the Chief Administrative Officer to authorize trapping on municipal land and sign annual agreements with the Hearst Trappers Council for the control of nuisance beavers.
- Participation of Mayor Sigouin to the North East Region Police Services Board meeting to be held in North Bay on June 8, 2026.

OPERATIONS

- Establishment of the Town of Hearst Local Improvement Policy.

FINANCES

- Termination of the monthly service agreement with Canadian Injury Management Services Inc. (CIMS) for employee wellness and disability management services. These services will hereon be assured internally by municipal staff.
- Renewal of the annual contribution to the Hearst Ecomuseum, in the amount of \$6,850 for the year 2026, in addition to an amount equal to the municipal and school taxes of the Blais House located at 53 Ninth Street, as well as the contribution of labour and equipment required for snow removal and lawn mowing of the property, and the annual fee for the alarm system.
- Denial of the request for financial assistance from Animal Rescue of Kapuskasing.

PARKS AND RECREATION

- Approval of Jogues Mud Fest organizing committee's request for free use of the Town of Hearst fences, for their annual Mud Fest event being held in Jogues on August 14 to 16, 2026.
